



CHRISTMAS IN THE NURSERY SCHOOL



The guests have a unique opportunity to experience backward time travelling and once again be a part of a Christmas carnival in the nursery school. The evening is going to be care free and fun, just like in childhood.

DETAILED DESCRIPTION:

INVITATION

A few weeks in advance each guest receives a nostalgic vintage Christmas card picturing Santa Claus. The card contains the time and the place of the event as well as the dress code: children carnival costumes (for example, a dwarf, Snow White, a bear, a squirrel, etc.).

WELCOMING OF THE GUESTS

The organizers do their homework and prepare a video projection that consists of the employees' childhood photos. They can be seen standing next to a Christmas tree, with Santa or other children. The projection is the first thing the guests see upon entering the venue. Later the photos are going to be used in the game called "Guess who's in the photo", and the winners are going to get prizes – sweets and chocolate, just like in childhood.

The Snow White (an event assistant) meets the guests and gives each of them a small present – a lollipop. The guests who aren't wearing a carnival costume are given paper bunny ears, just like in the old times.

As for the music, DJ is playing relevant background music. The refreshments are the all-time children favorites – lemonade and hot dogs.

OPENING OF THE EVENT

The event opens with a mini speech of the nursery school principal (aka the Company's CEO). Then the nursery teacher (aka the Host of the Event) asks the 'children' to sing a well-known Christmas song. This done, they sit at the tables to have a hot meal.

A Christmas Play

Next, it's time for a Christmas play. This is an original performance based on the popular fairy tale "The Snow White and the Seven Dwarfs" (or any other fairy tale of your choice). The teacher divides the 'children' into five groups; in each group, the main characters are selected (the Snow White, seven dwarfs, the stepmother, the prince, etc.). Then each group is given the props (prepared by the organizers in advance). The teams create a play based on the same fairy tale but in different genres, such as a romantic comedy, a thriller, a soap opera, a horror movie or similar. They aren't given much time, just enough to remember the storyline and have a brief rehearsal. The rest is going to be pure improvisation. The DJ is going to play pieces relevant for each genre (prepared in advance). Looking at a well-known childhood story from a fresh, unexpected angle should be really entertaining.

Afterwards, it's time for the Duck Dance. It's a boys-only affair, and the 'children' who aren't dancing select the most attractive duckling 😊.

Then it's the girls' turn: they hold a Chinese jump rope competition to remember and enjoy this childhood classics once again. The teacher tells the girls who want to participate what jump pattern to follow (which can be both complicated and funny), and the most original participants are awarded prizes – soft toys.

The 'children' have a rest as professional dancers in the Snow White costumes dance to the music of "Jingle Bells" and other popular pieces.

And finally, the final competition for the 'children': the game "Guess who's in the photo". The teacher shows the photos and the guests guess, which colleague that might be.

Once the performances, games and competitions are over, the teacher announces that a new great teacher is coming to join them. The new teacher – a popular singer/band – enters the stage. The guests listen to the good old songs, sing along and dance.

A children's Christmas party is not complete without Santa and presents. He comes carrying a huge sack filled with presents, but, as the old tradition goes, the 'children' have to say a poem or sing a song (or do something else equally creative) in order to get their presents.

It's time for a sweet treat – a huge cake with cake fountain sparklers. Afterwards, there's a disco – only this time in a grown-up style 😊.
